This email relates to the Noise Assessment report (ref 2200170-01) prepared by Ardent for the development at 248 Hart Road, Thundersley.

The Noise Assessment details the required glazing and ventilation minimum performance values for facades at the development. It also assumes that a minimum sound reduction performance will be achieved for non-glazed elements based on these elements being constructed with a masonry cavity wall.

It is understood that the proposed construction for the non-glazed elements is in fact as follows:

- 102mm facing brickwork
- 55mm air gap
- 120mm mineral wool insulation
- 112mm CLT
- 12.5mm plasterboard

Having reviewed the above, we can confirm that the proposed wall construction is expected to meet the minimum performance values in the report for non-glazed elements and it does not change the outcome of the assessment.
