Subject: Appeal against refusal to grant a Private Hire Driver's Licence –
Applicant E

Report of: Head of Licensing and Safer Communities

1. Purpose of Report

To consider the appeal made by Applicant E against the refusal by the Council to grant a Private Hire Driver's Licence.

2. Background

2.1 Applicant E applied for a Private Hire Driver's Licence in January 2023. The Council refused to progress the application due to the driving endorsements declared by the applicant.

Applicant E has the following motoring convictions recorded on his driving licence:

- 3 April 2022
 CU80 Breach of requirements as to control of the vehicle, mobile telephone etc
 Penalty Points - 6
- 10 October 2020
 TT99 "Totting Up" if the total of penalty points reaches 12 or more within 3 years.
 Disgualification 6 months
- 2.2 As the applicant declared that he had previously been licensed with other authorities, enquiries were made with Maldon District Council and Transport for London (TFL). Applications had been refused by both authorities.
- 2.3 The legislation relating to the refusal to grant a driver's licence is contained under the provisions of the LG(MP)A 1976, section 51, whereby at 51.(1) subject to the provisions of this part of this Act, a district council shall, on receipt of an

application from any person for the grant of a licence to drive private hire vehicles, grant to that person a driver's licence:

Provided that a district council shall not grant a licence-

- (a) unless they are satisfied that the Applicant E is a fit and proper person to hold a driver's licence: or
- (b) to any person who has not for at least twelve months been and is not at the date of the application for a driver's licence, the holder of a licence granted under Part III of the Act of 1972 (not being a provisional licence) authorising him to drive a motor car.
- (2) A district council may attach to the grant of a licence under this section such conditions as they may consider reasonably necessary.
- (3) It shall be the duty of a council by which licences are granted in pursuance of this section to enter, in a register maintained by the council for the purpose, the following particulars of each such licence, namely-
 - (a) the name of the person to whom it is granted;
 - (b) the date on which and the period for which granted; and
 - (c) if the licence has a serial number, that number, and to keep the register available at its principal offices for inspection by members of the public during office hours free of charge.

Under S52. Any person aggrieved by -

- the refusal of the district council to grant a driver's licence under section 51 of this Act; or
- any conditions attached to the grant of a driver's licence;

may appeal to a magistrate's court.

3. Castle Point Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licensing Policy

3.1 Private Hire Drivers Licence Pre-Licensing Standards

"An applicant must be over twenty-one years of age and have held a current full licence issued by the Driver and Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA) to drive a motorcar for not less than three years immediately prior to making the application for a driver's badge and not to have been disqualified from driving for any period of time during the three years prior to making the application.

3.2 Assessment of Previous Convictions

Guidance on assessment of previous convictions was contained within the Department for Transport's (DFT) Statutory Taxi and Private Hire Vehicle Standards released in July 2020. These standards were adopted by the Council in November 2020 following a period of consultation and include the following in relation to driving offences:

Offence	Elapsed period before licence should be issued		
Conviction for using a hand held mobile phone or device while driving	at least 5 years since completion of sentence imposed		
Applicants with multiple driving offences	May indicate that an applicant does not exhibit the behaviours of a safe road user and one that is suitable to drive professionally		

The full Assessment of Convictions is attached at Appendix 3.

4. 'Fit and Proper'

The definition of what is a fit and proper person is not defined in law however the generally accepted test is:

> - Would you allow your son, daughter, mother, spouse or other person you care about to get into a vehicle with this person alone?

This definition was supported in the judgement by HHJ Silber in the case of Leeds City Council v Hussain which surrounds the suspension of a driver:

...'the purpose of the power of suspension is to protect the users of licensed vehicles and those who are driven by them and members of the public. Its purpose is to prevent licences being given or used by those who are not suitable people taking into account their driving record, their driving experience, their sobriety, mental and physical fitness, honesty and that they are people who would not take advantage of their employment to abuse or assault people.'

As Applicant E has the above convictions and has been refused a licence by two other local authorities he is not regarded as a fit and proper person to hold a Private Hire Driver's Licence and the Council made the decision to refuse the application.

Applicant E submitted a written appeal against this decision to the Council by email on 3 February 2023. A copy is attached at Appendix 5.

5. Legal implications

Decisions in relation to the grant of a licence give rise to the obligations under the Human Rights Act 1998. The Council will therefore ensure that there is a review hearing before the Licensing Sub-Committee. It should be noted that Applicant E has the right to appeal the decision made by the Council to the Magistrates Court if he is aggrieved by the decision of the Sub-Committee.

6. Options

The Sub-Committee is advised that it has the following options when determining this application.

- Uphold the decision to refuse the Private Hire Driver's Licence (i) application
- (ii) Allow the Private Hire Driver's Licence application to progress.

Recommendation

The decision of the Sub Committee is required following proper consideration of the application and any representations made to the Sub Committee.

A change in legislation means that, from the 15th November 2021, drivers will be able to choose to take a lorry or bus trailer test without having to take a test in the rigid vehicle first.

An additional legislative change from the 16th December 2021 also means that drivers with B (Car) entitlement will automatically have B+E (Car & Trailer) entitlement without the need to take a B+E test. This will allow licence holders to tow a vehicle up to 3,500kg Maximum Authorised Mass (MAM).

Please note that these changes will not be reflected on current driving licences, or on any of our online services. There is no need to contact DVLA regarding this change, photocard driving licences will be updated the next time licence holders transact with DVLA.

Each case will be considered on its own merits and applicants / licensees are entitled to a fair and impartial consideration of their application.

Where a period is given below it will be taken to be a **minimum** in considering whether a licence should be granted or renewed in most cases. This puts passenger safety first while enabling past offenders to sufficiently evidence that they have rehabilitated.
