Appeal against refusal to grant a Private Hire Driver's Licence -

Applicant A

Report of: Head of Licensing and Safer Communities

Purpose of Report

To consider the appeal made by Applicant A against the refusal by the Council to grant a Private Hire Driver's Licence.

Background

Applicant A applied for a Private Hire Driver's Licence in October 2022. The Council refused to progress the application on receipt of his Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) certificate because Applicant A has the following convictions:

Date of conviction: 26 February 2016

Offence 1: Common Assault

Disposal: Unpaid Work Requirement. Fine £50

Offence 2: Destroy or Damage Property

Disposal: Compensation £200

Offence 3: Destroy or Damage Property

Disposal: Compensation £200

A copy of the DBS certificate is attached at Appendix 1.

The legislation relating to the refusal to grant a driver's licence is contained under the provisions of the LG(MP)A 1976, section 51, whereby at 51.(1) subject to the provisions of this part of this Act, a district council shall, on receipt of an application from any person for the grant of a licence to drive private hire vehicles, grant to that person a driver's licence:

Provided that a district council shall not grant a licence-

- (a) unless they are satisfied that the applicant is a fit and proper person to hold a driver's licence: or
- (b) to any person who has not for at least twelve months been and is not at the date of the application for a driver's licence, the holder of a licence granted under Part III of the Act of 1972 (not being a provisional licence) authorising him to drive a motor car.
- (2) A district council may attach to the grant of a licence under this section such conditions as they may consider reasonably necessary.
- (3) It shall be the duty of a council by which licences are granted in pursuance of this section to enter, in a register maintained by the council for the purpose, the following particulars of each such licence, namely-
 - (a) the name of the person to whom it is granted;
 - (b) the date on which and the period for which granted; and
 - (c) if the licence has a serial number, that number, and to keep the register available at its principal offices for inspection by members of the public during office hours free of charge.

Under S52. Any person aggrieved by -

- the refusal of the district council to grant a driver's licence under section 51 of this Act; or
- (2) any conditions attached to the grant of a driver's licence;

may appeal to a magistrate's court.

CPBC Policy – Assessment of Previous Convictions

Guidance on assessment of previous convictions was contaned within the Department of Transport's Statutory Taxi and Private Hire Vehicle Standards released in July 2020. These standards were adopted by the Council in November 2020 following a period of consultation.

The convictions listed above means that Applicant A does not meet the Council's pre licensing requirements.

Extract from the Council's Hackney Carriage and Private Hire Licencing Policy "Assessment of Previous Convictions" is attached at Appendix 2.

'Fit and Proper'

The definition of what is a fit and proper person is not defined in law however the generally accepted test is:

 Would you allow your son, daughter, mother, spouse or other person you care about to get into a vehicle with this person alone?
 This definition was supported in the judgement by HHJ Silber in the case of Leeds City Council v Hussain which surrounds the suspension of a driver: ...'the purpose of the power of suspension is to protect the users of licensed vehicles and those who are driven by them and members of the public. Its purpose is to prevent licences being given or used by those who are not suitable people taking into account their driving record, their driving experience, their sobriety, mental and physical fitness, honesty and that they are people who would not take advantage of their employment to abuse or assault people.'

As Applicant A has been convicted of the above offences he is not regarded as a fit and proper person to hold a driver's licence and the Council made the decision to refuse to progress the application.

Applicant A submitted a written appeal against this decision to the Council on 1 March 2023. A copy is attached at Appendix 3

4. Legal implications

Decisions in relation to the grant of a licence give rise to the obligations under the Human Rights Act 1998. The Council will therefore ensure that there is a review hearing before the Licensing Sub-Committee. It should be noted that Applicant A has the right to appeal the decision made by the Council to the Magistrates Court if he is aggrieved by the decision of the Sub-Committee.

Options

The Sub-Committee is advised that it has the following options when determining this application.

- Uphold the decision to refuse to progress the Private Hire Driver's Licence application
- (ii) Allow the Private Hire Driver's Licence application to progress.

Recommendation

The decision of the Sub Committee is required following proper consideration of the application and any representations made to the Sub Committee.

Assessment of Previous Convictions

Legislation specifically identifies offences involving dishonesty, indecency or violence as a concern when assessing whether an individual is fit and proper. The following reflects this.

Each case will be considered on its own merits and applicants / licensees are entitled to a fair and impartial consideration of their application.

Where a period is given below it will be taken to be a **minimum** in considering whether a licence should be granted or renewed in most cases. This puts passenger safety first while enabling past offenders to sufficiently evidence that they have rehabilitated.

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Dear Sirs,

I confirm on the 26th February 2016 I pleaded guilty to the following offences:

- 1. One count of common assault
- 2. Two counts of destroying and damaging property

I was ordered to pay a penalty and complete unpaid work. I can confirm the fine has been paid in full and I have completed the duration of unpaid work.

This was my only offence and since 2016 I have not committed any further offences. I pleaded guilty at court as I was remorseful for my actions and held myself responsible for the offences committed and was ready to accept the sentence the judge was going to give me.

At the time of the offence I was young and not in the right state of mind. My parents had just split and we were constantly moving around as my mother became homeless with me and my 4 siblings. I was a victim of abuse from a young age and was from a broken home.

I deeply regret the incident that occurred and I am trying my best to rise above and build a future for myself and my family.

I was granted my SIA license and during the Covid pandemic I worked as a Covid Response Officer working on behalf of the London Borough Of Barking & Dagenham council. My role was to ensure businesses in the borough were adhering to the rules and measures and all customers were wearing masks and enforcing fines of up to £10,000.00 to businesses not adhering to Covid rules and measures in place.

As you can imagine my role was challenging and I had abuse hurled at me on a daily basis and was even sometimes threatened with physical violence BUT I carried out my role professionally and handled the situations calmly and collectively.

I am a dad to my daughter and a very loving caring man who would not wish harm upon anyone. I want to work and build a life for me and my family and I love driving so that is why I wish to choose being a taxi driver as a career. A big part of wanting to be granted a license is also due to the flexible hours I can work which would mean I can still spend time with my family.

I am not a bad person, I was young and naive and have never committed any offences or been part of any crimes since 2016. My nature is so calm and I am such a down to earth person and I'm really devastated that the 1 incident is having such a big impact on my life. I would like to request you please give me this opportunity by accepting my appeal to show how willing I am. I will be a hardworking, reliable individual who will work for the industry with pride and honour.

I will treat every passenger with respect and treat them how I would want my own family members to be treated.

Please don't let 1 mistake ruin my chances as I am willing to prove myself. I can also obtain character references if needed.

Please do not refuse my application.
